How to Cook a Snapper Fillet

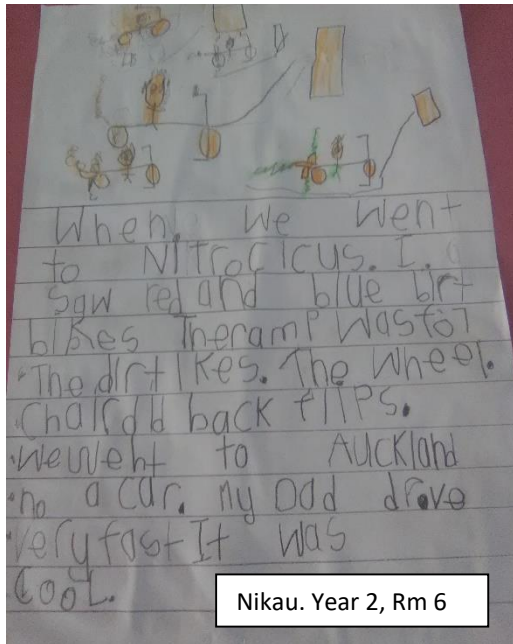
- Preheat the oven to 180°C and oil a baking tray.
- Place the snapper fillets on the tray and season with salt and pepper.
- Cook the fish for 10-12 minutes until the flesh is white and flakes easily.

Strep Throat

We have had a few queries about Strep throat and whether or not it is contagious.

Strep throat is contagious for about 2-3 weeks in individuals that do not take antibiotics. However, individuals that take antibiotics for strep throat usually are no longer contagious about 24 hours after initiating antibiotic therapy. So children probably do not need to miss more than 1 or 2 days schooling.
