Term 4 Focus

Learning during Term 4 is a continuation of 'Wellbeing' with a focus on putting into practice the strategies for taking care of self/whānau/community and developing wellness takeaway kits in preparation for the Xmas break. Whanau are working on different aspects of wellbeing in each whānau;

Whānau Marama are exploring Atua Maori, creating their own avatar's, bringing those to life with an end of term catwalk creation.

Whānau Matariki are consolidating learning of Te Whare Tapa Wha and are looking at developing 'takeaway' resources for wellbeing.

Whānau Kopunui have combined the Maramataka (the guiding system our people used to live by) and Pātaka kaupapa to study when the most productive time to plant and harvest food sources. Our aim is for our tuakana to create Pātaka kai with traditionally sourced foods and forms of preservation, as well as a Pātaka taonga that our teina will fill with the taonga they create throughout this term. Our Pātaka kai and taonga will be shared with our whanau during our hakari whakamutunga tau.
