From MONDAY 21 MARCH to FRIDAY 25 MARCH 2022, the school will move to distance learning. The school will remain open for STAFF ONLY.

Essential workers: those who work in services providing food, medicine, healthcare, energy, or fuel who have no support at home to care for tamariki. HARD LEARNING PACKS

Hard learning packs will be available via the office. Please request learning packs by messaging the school Facebook page OR by calling 0800MOEREW A so that we can ensure that our tamariki receive the appropriate pack. NAMED learning packs will be located, on the steps of the old dental clinic (the building opposite the school office) in a drawer, with the corresponding classroom number on it. Please take your child's named pack when picking up, you do not need to come into the school office area.

We will be in touch with whanau via text notification and via our school Facebook page. Please contact our office if you need any urgent support. Also, refer to the attached information regarding the support services in place in our community should any whānau be impacted by COVID-19.
